Along the way, I discovered annoying anomalies in both applications in Acquire information from their CD databases. The situation today, when it comes to getting information about music CDs, are much better than the early days of the CDDB (now Gracenote.) But it's still far from perfect. Now that I have a pretty good setting for broadcasting digital music around the house, I wanted to make music more widely accessible to other family members. That means moving a lot of classical music CDs that we have to the hard drive, because my wife Jan is a great classical music buff. For various reasons rip using iTunes and Windows Media Player, using each player without losing the codec. Both seem to treat cd data differently. Apple's iTunes already uses this Gracenote database. Microsoft manages its CD database. In some cases, errors also appear to be in both cases. Take, for example, Gorecki Symphony No. 3. The first time you insert a CD, Windows Media Player 11 does not recognize the content. However, if you manually tell WMP11 to obtain information about the CD, you get a complete list!On the other hand, iTunes immediately recognized the CD and correctly identified the tracks and tag correctly. However, he was unable to supply the albums. When you try to manually get an art album, it seems to be un available:Ironically, I added album art to iTunes by copying the bitmap that was saved in the Player 11 library. Let's go even more obscured. My wife's aunt, Enid Katahn, is a classical pianist who has had numerous CDs published by smaller publishers. I tore up the CD of Pierre DuBois's compositions played by Katahn on both players. Once again, iTunes correctly identified the CD, artist and track information – but there are no artworks. WMP11 was completely fainted:When I manually tried to add album information, WMP11 was still unhappy. Then I tried on the kapuljku to search for information about the album by the artist's name. So, click through the Next button and see what we found:Click on the Dubois Music for Piano entry and press the following return, what do we need:So why did windows Media Player not be able to identify the CD when it was inserted? We'd like to know about the minds. I've had similar results with less obscure classic CDs. For example, let's look at Telemann: Suites Concerto in D Major:But when I manually searched the database, they sought the correct information:Once again, iTunes has found the correct CD but missing the album art:Now let's dig into my cherky musical past. I have some guilty pleasures, and I confess to the whole world that I have a problem. It's embarrassing, I know, but there it is: I have a CD of Emerson, Lake and Palmer's Works Vol. 1, one of the most multiplying, inflated pieces of progressive stone from the era of inflated, multiplied progressive rock. It's definitely a guilty pleasure. Apple's software gets all the tracks right from both CDs (it's a two-parter), but I had to add to differentie additional live songs from studio tracks. (The live tracks were not on the original version of Part Vol. 1. Microsoft in a different way manages to get information about the CD:That's right, we don't have information about the song, but the album art is correct! Actually, I'm a little unfair here. The Microsoft database correctly recognized CD 1, but it included all the song information from both CDs, even though I only rip the CD1. When I inserted CD2, the above screenshot was displayed. I had to manually split songs from the CD1 list that were on CD2, which contained all the songs. Actually, I could go on one list. However, the Microsoft database appeared to contain data from a previous version of Works Vol.1 because the live tracks added were unknown. I had to manually add that. In any case, I can understand the problems that are consistent with the pattern recognition type required for CD ID correctly, since music CDs are not stored metadata on them. However, you would think that record publishers would actually supply the correct information to Gracenote or Microsoft... But then, maybe not. The curmdgeons at the RIAA probably think this encourages piracy. That's just some of my problems. There was a time when WMP10 tore up the Mark Knopfler CD (Sailing to Philadelphia) and continued to create five or six different entries, with one or two songs, for each of the various performers who collaborated with Knopfler.
